Subj: EXTENSIBLE MARKUP LANGUAGE (XML) NAMING AND DESIGN RULES
OFFICIAL RELEASE

To comply with joint requirements as embodied in the DoD Net-Centric Data Strategy and to achieve the FORCENet requirement for a common structure and language for information handling, the Department of the Navy (DON) is issuing Naming and Design Rules (NDR) that facilitate the discovery and use of common data across the naval enterprise. XML, an open standards based technology, is a key enabler of the Department's net-centric data strategy.

The NDR provides additional rigor necessary to efficiently and effectively operate in a net-centric data-sharing environment. These rules move the DON forward to ensure that all XML is based on a consistent set of schema through the application of open standards that align with the Federal Enterprise Architecture Data Reference Model and Global Information Grid. The result will be an environment that is sustainable, responsive, and agile.

The NDR is the product of expertise and energies contributed by representatives from 13 key Navy, Marine Corps, and Secretary of the Navy organizations who participated in the DON XML Working Group. To ensure these rules are applicable and current, the DON Chief Information Officer (DON CIO) has established the XML Business Standards Council and is proceeding to charter the Net-Centric Technical Standards Council to serve as liaison to organizations developing national and international standards for XML and Web Services technologies.

All commands in the Navy and Marine Corps that are developing systems that use XML, in accordance with our DON XML Policy, should apply these standards in order to maximize interoperability and enable a net-centric environment for enhancing supportability of operations across the Department.

To comply with joint requirements as embodied in the "DoD Net-Centric Data Strategy," reference (a), and to achieve the FORCENet requirement for a common structure and language for information handling, the Department of the Navy Chief Information Officer (DON CIO) is issuing the Naming and Design Rules that enable the discovery and use of common data across the naval enterprise. XML, an open standards based technology, is a key enabler of the Department's net-centric data strategy.

Reference (b) promulgated the DON XML vision - to fully exploit XML as an enabling technology to achieve interoperability in support of maritime information superiority. Reference (c) established formal DON XML Policy to establish the necessary roles, responsibilities and governance structure to achieve that vision. DON enterprise-level XML Naming and Design Rules (NDR), Enclosure (1), provides the third component of our strategic approach and is required for use by all DON organizations developing new or updated XML components that will be registered in accordance with the guidance provided in reference (a).

The DON XML NDR is a culmination of the contributions of representatives from Navy, Marine Corps, and SECNAV organizations actively engaged in the DON XML Working Group over the past two years. The NDR establishes rules that move us toward the use of the latest XML components such as XML schemas. It provides explicit requirements for developing a robust, enterprise-level XML, an approach that will ensure that XML enhances, rather than detracts, from DON Enterprise interoperability. The NDR supersedes the DON XML Developers Guide, Version 1.1.

As we implement solutions that leverage the benefits of XML, adherence to the NDR is critical. Your support is essential for the Department to successfully transform to an interoperable, net-centric environment and to align with the DoD Net-Centric Data Strategy. I encourage you to participate in the DON XML working groups that will continue to provide necessary standards, guidance, and harmonization processes to support XML implementation initiatives across the DON and to assure alignment with emerging Federal and Department of Defense net-centric strategies.

The DON CIO recognizes that not all projects and systems will be able to take advantage of this technology immediately. In that event, please coordinate with my staff to develop a migration path that will allow you to implement conformant XML solutions in the future.
